Mixed Curling League By-laws

Revised: January 6, 2020

1. Army, Navy and Air Force Veterans in Canada (ANAF) Unit # 376 Mixed Curling League shall be made up of the Unit Members, spouses, family, Ladies Auxiliary and spouses, Royal Canadian Legion Members in good standing and Unit Guests at the discretion of the Unit Executive.
2. Members shall promote the game of curling in the ANAF Mixed Curling League.
3. To hold functions from time to time as may be deemed necessary to promote fraternal relationships among the Members of the Curling League.
4. The Executive shall consist of President and Vice President, who must be members of the ANAF Unit 376, three (3) Directors and the Past President. The Past President will act as ex-officio. A quorum for the Executive will be three (3).
5. Signing officers shall be any two (2) or three (3): President, Vice President and Treasurer.
6. The President shall appoint Secretary-Treasurer, or a Secretary and Treasurer from its Directors elected.
7. The Election of Officers will be held every year at the last regular league game of the curling season.
8. The President may from time to time call a meeting.
9. Fees for the first half shall be fully paid by the second (2nd) Sunday of curling and the Fees for the second (2nd) half shall be paid by the second game in the second (2nd) half.
10. Skips will be chosen for the number of rinks by the Draw Committee. All other players will be pulled from the hat by the Draw Committee.
11. All disputes must be presented to the Executive for a decision.
12. If a player drops out, he/she should be replaced with a player of equal status giving first choice to those on the spare board.
13. If any player is going to be absent for a game, at least 48 hours notice must be given to their skip. Players are responsible for finding their own spare and advising the skip.
14. If a complete rink is absent for a game, they will lose by default.
15. All regular thirds (3rd) must move up in the case of a missing skip and an eligible can fill any position from lead to third (3rd) providing the other team members do not wish to move up. Under no circumstances can a player be moved down and allow their position to be filled by a spare.
16. When a new player joins the Curling League, it should be up to their fellow team mates to teach them as much as possible.
17. There are rules of etiquette to be observed at all times for the consideration of your Comrade curlers.
18. All games must be a minimum of six (6) ends.
19. In rules of play not covered by the above by-laws, they shall be governed by the Canadian Curling Association (CCA) Rules. Any changes will become effective when CCA rules become effective.
